Cantor's Notes



The Hebrew month of *Elul* began this year on August 21st. According to our tradition, this month begins a forty day period of introspection and repentance that concludes with the beautiful service of *Neilah* on Yom Kippur. For many of us, the process of *teshuvah* (returning both to God and to our authentic selves) is not an easy one. Yet, it is the grand purpose of the upcoming High Holidays, and the more we take its call seriously the more we will benefit from its spiritual rewards.

In light of what is at stake as we prepare for our New Year encounter with the Divine, I would like to share with you the following Hassidic story. It was told by Reb Chaim Halberstam of Zanz to help his disciples prepare for the Ten Day of Repentance and its goals of *teshuvah* (repentance) and *tikkun* (repair).

“Once a woman became lost in a dense forest. She wandered this way and that in the hope of stumbling on a way out, but she only got more lost as the hours went by. Then she chanced upon another person walking in the woods. Hoping that he might know the way out, she said, ‘Can you tell me which path leads out of this forest?’

‘I am sorry, but I cannot,’ the man said. ‘I am quite lost myself.’

‘You have wandered in one part of the woods,’ the woman said, ‘while I have been lost in another. Together we may not know the way out, but we know quite a few paths that lead nowhere. Let us share what we know of the paths that fail, and then together we may find the one that succeeds.’

‘What is true for these lost wanderers,’ Reb Chaim said, ‘is true of us as well. We may not know the way out, but let us share with each other the ways that have only led us back in.’”

We belong to a remarkable tradition. We believe that human beings are capable of change. We believe that we have the capacity to mend our ways. No one is perfect. All have erred. Let us take these precious days to mend our failures not just as individuals, but also as a community that has shared many aspects of a common journey, together.

Together we are always stronger. Together we can find the path out of any difficulty and surmount any stumbling blocks. Together we can reach our goal of standing before the Divine with both confidence and joy, having returned to what truly matter to ourselves, our community, our world, and our God.

May we all be inscribed for life, together!

Through the President's Lens

A Message from David Inhaber

Few things are more important and impactful than the promise of new beginnings. Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur are milestone days in our calendar where we reserve time to pray and reaffirm our spiritual connection with God. It is a time when we reach out to and reconnect with loved ones. It is a time to reflect honestly on the events of the past year and to plan for the future.

This year will be no different; yet, as we all know, the COVID-19 Pandemic is prompting us to connect in unique ways.

Many Synagogues throughout North America have made the difficult decision not to hold in-person High Holidays services, but Beth Tzedec has chosen to open our doors with strict COVID protocols.

Those of you that have already attended the limited in-person weekday and Shabbat services we've offered know the experience is different than what it was pre-COVID. I can visit my friends in the parking lot but when I enter the sanctuary, I'm distanced from everyone else. The side conversations no longer exist, and I'm left in my own space with a mask covering my face. There has been an upside to that surreal experience in that I now devote all my time in the sanctuary to what I came there for in the first place – enhancing my spirituality and bonding with God.

This High Holidays will truly be different than any we have previously experienced. We are paving the way to a new normal and I invite every congregant to be a part of this whether you choose to join us in-person or via live stream.

What I'm excited about this year is that we are offering our main sanctuary services and our family-friendly youth services in an inclusive new way. Congregants will no longer have to choose between the two, as the youth service will follow the main service each day of Rosh Hashanah and on Yom Kippur.

Speaking of youth, those of you who have been following developments in *Shalom Byte*, *Shofar* and occasional eblasts know we are building a team of Youth leaders to run our youth programs. They will work together with our wonderful new Youth Engagement Director and Ritual Assistant, Jonah Potasznik, to help immerse our youth in Jewish activities that are meaningful and fun.

During Beth Tzedec's business update in June, I spoke about the role that parents and grandparents must play in encouraging the participation of their children and grandchildren in Beth Tzedec programming for youth, young adults and young families. We will be far more successful in engaging succeeding generations if we

act as role models and show, rather than merely tell, our kids and grandkids how important and rewarding it is to come together as a community.

While there is always more work to do, we have a lot to celebrate at Beth Tzedec! We can celebrate that our National Minyan League (NML) volunteers and other congregants have stepped up to participate in weekday Zoom services. We haven't found ourselves short of a minyan since we pivoted to Zoom services. Our live streamed Shabbat services have consistently attracted 40 households on Friday evenings and over 100 on Shabbat. We have cautiously added some in-person services over the summer and will be reintroducing B'nai Mitzvah celebrations commencing this month. Weddings and other lifecycle celebrations will follow shortly.

Your generous support of Beth Tzedec allows us to be here for you when you need us. My greatest joy is when I hear that you have renewed your commitment to – and support for – your Beth Tzedec family.

We can't do what we do without you. Similarly, none of what we do could happen without the commitment and dedication of our Cantor, Executive Director Max Lipsman and his administrative and operations team, and our Executive and Board of Directors. There aren't enough words to properly thank them and our many volunteers.

The High Holidays are a time for reflection, spiritual renewal, and religious growth. This year – perhaps more than most – we need to come together as a community.

Community is stronger than COVID, but only if we respect the science. If you are ill, or your age and/or underlying conditions make it risky for you to join us in-person, please consider joining us online.

Whichever way you choose to connect to your Beth Tzedec family, we warmly welcome you and thank you for ensuring that our congregation remains strong.

On behalf of the Board of Directors, I wish you and all your loved ones a happy New Year blessed with good health. May we enjoy many meaningful and memorable moments together.




Nathan Billie Verbuck

In-person Prayer Service Guidelines

Beth Tzedec Congregation is pleased to be able to offer in-person services in accordance with the most up-to-date COVID-19 guidelines provided by Alberta Health Services.

Congregants are encouraged to use the online Alberta Health self-screening tool at <https://myhealth.alberta.ca/Journey/COVID-19/Pages/COVID-Self-Assessment.aspx> before every visit to Beth Tzedec, and are strongly discouraged from attending in-person services when feeling unwell.

Beth Tzedec will continue to offer all of our weekday Minyanim via Zoom and Shabbat Services via live streaming to ensure that all congregants are able to participate in prayer services, whether or not they are able to join us in person.

Please note the following guidelines and rules for in-person prayer services:

- Worshippers must register no later than one business day in advance at 403-255-8688 or info@bethtzedec.ca (during office hours) and check in with the staff member posted at the front door. You will be asked some COVID-19 screening questions. Please note that worshippers will be admitted for prayer services only if they are symptom-free and in good health.
- Staff will be available to answer any questions when you enter the building.
- People who are high risk (i.e. over 65, chronic medical conditions, younger individuals with medical conditions that put them at risk) are encouraged to stay home. Please refrain from joining us if you are ill.
- Please use hand sanitizer on your way into the building and on your way out and at every opportunity available.
- You are required to wear a mask at all times. We are encouraging congregants to bring their own masks. If you do not have a mask, one will be provided to you.
- All congregants and staff are required to maintain social distancing (keep at least 2 metres distance from people outside your household or cohort family) at all times.
- Refrain from kissing, hugging or shaking hands.
- Bring your own Tallitot, kippot and women's head coverings as they will not be provided.
- There will no kissing of mezuzot or Torah scrolls.
- When entering the sanctuary you will be directed to take a prayer book from a designated area and required to return your siddur to another drop area.
- Family members who are living and isolating in the same home may sit together but please ensure that there are three (3) empty seats on either side of your family grouping.

- Listen to all instructions provided to you by our Cantor, staff and on-duty ushers.
- We have enhanced and increased our COVID-19 sanitization protocols. Extensive cleaning and disinfecting will take place on a regular schedule including just prior to and following prayer services.
