Rabbi Cantor's Corner



Tisha b'Av is a fast day that commemorates the destruction of our ancient temple, first in 586 BCE, then again in 70 CE. I fast and pray on Tisha b'Av, but I don't want the Temple to be rebuilt. I have severe doubts about what would happen at a restored Temple site. Given the chaos that has accompanied Women of the Wall and the development of an egalitarian prayer space at the Kotel, the thoughts of what scenes might be associated with a Temple restored doesn't do a lot for me.

Yet, I do mourn on *Tisha b'Av*. I grieve for the lost lives, the violence, and the hopelessness that plagued our people when both Temples were destroyed. I imagine structure, ritual and meaning destroyed, and what it must have been like staring into the abyss of a world where it seemed that God no longer dwelled. I cannot even start to imagine how scary and empty and unknowably sad it must have been.

That is why for us today, centuries after the Temple, *Tisha b'Av* has become a container into which we can pour all our sorrow and fear. For generations, Jewish catastrophes have been attached to this date. The Crusades are said to have been launched on this day. Expulsions from both England and Spain are connected with *Tisha b'Av*, as is the mass deportation from the Warsaw ghetto to death camps during the *Shoah*. *Tisha b'Av* helps gives shape to Jewish trauma. It is a day for communal mourning, for remembering what was, and for lamenting the loss of what might have been.

Now a mythic telling of the *Tisha b'Av* story would end there, but that really doesn't work for me and it might not work for you as 21st Century North American Jews. That is because, in the words of historian James Young, our traumatic memory is not only collective, it is also "collected." What this means is that our memory consists not only of the overarching story of our people, but also of personal narratives and experiences that we as individual Jews bring to the overall story.

Sometimes, these individual experiences map easily onto the history of our people such as the firsthand accounts of Crusaders' rampages and the expulsion from Spain, or the oral histories that continue to chronicle the experiences of *Holocaust* survivors. Yet sometimes people bear sorrow that is not part of our collective Jewish myth, but are still a central part of their own Jewish story and identity. Death, illness and violence haunt many of us, and many come to this day of communal sorrow with their own private burdens of suffering, not associated with the destruction of the Temple.

When I fast on *Tisha b'Av*, I try think of these people and their pain. I layer this onto my mourning for millennia of Jewish loss. I grieve for our collective trauma as well as for our collected traumas, and I pray not for a rebuilt Temple but for a future where we will only tell stories of abundance and joy.

May you all have a restful and restorative Summer.

Shalom,

In preparation for this article, I looked at my AGM address from last year. It contained the words "It's been a tough year". While this year still had us recovering from world health issues, I truly feel that we have done a lot of great things and the first chapter of

We celebrated Shavuot that same weekend, where we had an incredible evening of eating and learning with another 120 people. These events show that our members and prospective members are hungry for food, fun and most important – community! But these results only happens when you have an equation on the other side (sorry, I'm a math guy at heart). And our equation is the sum of superstars. I would also like to thank Rabbi Ilana, Max Lipsman and Elliott Steinberg for their important contributions throughout the year.

Another important part of the equation is our volunteers. I would like to highlight our National Minyan League. Thank you to all the daveners and team captains for not only ensuring we have twice daily Minyanim, but for also being there for each other, as a community, which is what I believe is the most important part of being a *kehilla*. Each year Beth Tzedec has the opportunity to name a Shem Tov, to recognize a volunteer who has gone above and beyond - this year our recipient is the NML Commissioner, Susan Inhaber. Susan's hard work and welcoming nature has helped grow the NML and we can't thank her enough for that, as well as the work she does on the Ritual Committee and volunteering whenever we ask. *Yasher Kochech* and *Todah Rabah* Susan!

Our Board of Directors volunteers hours of their time to look at the financial and overall health of the Shul. The message I'd like to leave everyone with is the following. Beth Tzedec is coming out of the COVID pandemic in a very strong position. I told you about the successful Shabbat Dinner and Shavuot program in June, and we have two or more b'nai mitzvahs each month. We have programs for all ages and different ways to connect. We are the Shul for Calgary's Conservative Jewish community not just for today, but for tomorrow as well. We are financially secure because of the generosity of our congregation. We are not a gym or a hockey team or a theatre company - we don't sell tickets or memberships. We are a gathering point around our combined Jewish experience, whether through prayer services, education, socializing or life cycle events. The funds given to Beth Tzedec are tzedakah, charity, and we do our best to steward them so that we can provide a synagogue for everyone who wants to be here. While we might show a sustainable amount printed on our renewals, it's only that number because of those who have been generous with the means to support those who need help. A special thank you to our LIFE & LEGACY donors, who see that planting seeds today can bring the fruit of tomorrow. I ask that you remember how important Beth Tzedec is not only to you and your family, but how important it is to Calgary's Jewish community. When you are planning your charitable giving, please think of Beth Tzedec as somewhere that will always be able to bring joy and comfort. And if you would like to be a part of that joy and comfort, our doors are open and volunteering is an important mitzvah. 
