At **Ulpan Sports**, participants use key Hebrew vocabulary words while playing team sports like Soccer, floor hockey, baseball, kickball and gaga - growing friendships, athletic skills and Hebrew knowledge.



At **Ulpan Arts**, participants incorporate key Hebrew vocabulary as they create collaborative works of art, music and/or theatre.

Both Ulpan Sports and Ulpan Arts are designed for learners of all backgrounds, whether your child is a Hebrew newbie or a Jewish day school veteran.
