

Casting Away our Misdeeds

Occasionally, people ask what kind of bread crumbs should be thrown for specific sins and misbehaviors.

Tashlich is a remarkable ceremony, symbolic and concrete all at the same time. Through this ritual, we express not only our desire to be free from sin but our continuing hope that we will be forgiven for past misdeeds. On the afternoon of the first day of Rosh Hashanah, or on the second day if the first day is a Shabbat, it is customary to go to a flowing body of water and to recite prayers while "casting" our sins (represented by breadcrumbs) into the water. As we read in Micah: "You will cast (tashlich) all your sins into the depths of the sea" (7:19).

While it is traditional to shake out the hems of one's clothing to ensure that all "sins" have been disposed of, tashlikh ceremonies differ all over the world. The Jews of Kurdistan had a custom to recite the tashlikh prayer near a river and then to jump into the water and swim around, instead of only shaking out the hems of their clothing.

By performing *tashlich*, we signify our hope that God will overlook our failings during the past year and grant us favour in the year to come.

Occasionally, people ask what kind of bread crumbs should be thrown. Here are suggestions for breads, adapted from Rabbi Richard J. Israel^{z"l}, which may be appropriate for specific sins and misbehaviors:

For ordinary sins -White Bread

For particularly

dark sins - Pumpernickel

For complex sins - Multi-Grain

For twisted sins - Pretzels

For tasteless sins - Rice Cakes

For sins of indecision - Waffles

For sins committed in haste - Matzoh

For sins of chutzpah - Fresh Bread

For substance abuse - Stoned Wheat

For petty larceny - Stollen

For committing auto theft - Caraway

For timidity/cowardice - Milk Toast

For ill-temperedness - Sourdough

For silliness, eccentricity - Nut Bread

For not giving full value - Shortbread

For jingoism, chauvinism - Yankee Doodles

For excessive irony - Rye Bread

For unnecessary chances - Hero Bread

For telling bad jokes/puns - Corn Bread

For war-mongering - Kaiser Rolls

For causing injury to others - Tortes

For being holier than thou - Bagels

For abrasiveness - Grits



For dropping in without notice - Popovers

For over-eating - Stuffing

For impetuosity - Quick Bread

For raising your voice too often -Challah

For pride and egotism - Puff Pastry

For sycophancy - Brownies

For being overly smothering - Angel Food Cake

For laziness - Any long loaf

May we all be inscribed for a good and sweet year!

The benefits of Shiluv extend even further as parents will gain valuable breathing room during the week.


