

PICTURE OF HIS LIFE

Israel/USA/Canada 2019 Directors: Yonatan Nir, Dani Menkin **English, Hebrew & Inuit with English subtitles** 71 minutes

Documentary

World-famous Israeli-born underwater wildlife stills photographer Amos Nachoum has swam with crocodiles and killer whales, with anacondas and with great white sharks. He has developed a unique approach that puts him face-to-face with his subjects, without any protection. But one major predator has always eluded him: he has always dreamed of swimming underwater with a polar bear and capturing it face-to-face on film. Barely escaping with his life on a previous attempt, he is determined to give it one last shot. The danger is real, perhaps more real than ever, but now, as he nears the end of his career, he knows that this is his last chance to get the picture of a lifetime. Set against the stunning stark landscapes of the Canadian Arctic, and featuring breathtaking underwater cinematography, this enthralling and moving documentary follows Amos on his heartfelt quest. As the journey unfolds, Amos contemplates the series of unspoken events from his past that drove him here, to the end of the world. It has been a long and painful journey, but where others find fear, Amos finds redemption.

UK/Germany 2019 Director: Marcus H. Rosenmuller English 113 minutes

Drama

When love blossoms between a young Englishwoman and a German PoW in post-war Britain, they must overcome prejudice, public hostility and personal tragedy in this epic drama based on the incredible true story of legendary soccer player Bert Trautmann. Against a backdrop of British post-war protest and prejudice, Trautmann, a German soldier and prisoner of war, secures the position of goalkeeper at Manchester City, and in so doing, becomes a soccer icon. His signing causes outrage to thousands of fans, many of them Jewish. But support comes from an unexpected source: a remarkable open letter to the press from Manchester's communal rabbi, Alexander Altmann, asking for Trautmann to be given a chance. Bert's love for Margaret carries him through and he wins over even his harshest opponents by winning the 1956 FA Cup Final, playing on with a broken neck to secure victory. But fate will soon twist the knife for Bert and Margaret, when their love and loyalty to each other is put to the ultimate test.

STITCHERS: TAPESTRY OF SPIRIT

Canada 2017 **Director: Tassie Notar** English 15 minutes

Short Documentary

This award-winning short documentary chronicles the inspiring journey behind one woman's ambitious project to write a complete Torah - in cross stitch. Launched by Torontonian Temma Gentles, an internationally renowned textile artist, "Torah Stitch by Stitch" invites participants to engage with words of Torah in a collaborative and socially inclusive textile art project aimed at promoting cooperation and understanding. Over 1,500 stitchers of different faiths and cultural backgrounds from 28 countries around the world are each stitching a portion in the hope that the final work, with full text in Hebrew and hundreds of illuminations, will become an inspiring traveling museum exhibit. A number of women from the Rimon Calgary Judaic Needlework Guild have participated in this meaningful artistic legacy project which, when completed, will represent over 150,000 hours of collaborative work

YOU ONLY DIE TWICE

Israel/Austria 2018 **Director: Yair Lev** Hebrew, English, German & Serbo-Croatian with English subtitles 88 minutes

Documentary

At the centre of this incredible but true "detective" story, is a man by the name of Ernst Bechinsky - a man who died in Israel in 1969 - and then again in Austria in 1987. When Israeli filmmaker Yair Lev inadvertently discovers that the identity of his grandfather, Ernst Bechinsky, had – apparently - been stolen during WWII, he sets out to unravel the mystery and uncover the truth about the "other" Ernst Bechinsky – a man who had lived with a Nazi SS family during the war, and later became president of a Jewish community in Austria. Who was this man who took on another man's identity? Why and how did he do it? What dark past did he wish to conceal? Unfolding in surprising and moving ways, the filmmaker's riveting journey takes him from Tel Aviv to Vienna, to Innsbruck and then to Zagreb, revealing a complicated history that leads to an emotionally fraught meeting between third generation descendents of Jews and Nazis.

THE UNORTHODOX

Israel 2018 Director: Eliran Malka Hebrew with English subtitles 93 minutes

Drama

Inspired by real-life events, The Unorthodox is a rousing and often humorous underdog story about the improbable beginnings of "Shas", the first political party in Israel to represent the disenfranchised Sephardic community. When Ya'akov Cohen's daughter is expelled from a prestigious school for ethnic reasons, he decides to fight back. It's 1983 and Ya'akov, a printer in Jerusalem, is just a regular guy. He has no money, connections or political experience. But he does have the will and the passion to take action, and a belief that he and other Sephardic Jews should be able to hold their heads up high. Ya'acov enlists the help of two friends, and together they start the first ethnic political group in Jerusalem. Their grassroots campaign is a ragtag operation that doesn't seem to stand a chance against the establishment, but then again, it's driven by a deep sense of conviction, humor and a whole lot of rage. Their efforts will ultimately reshape Israeli society in ways that continue to reverberate today.

GOLDA'S BALCONY, THE FILM (2019)

Director: Scott Schwartz English 86 minutes

Documentary

Six-time Emmy- and Tony-nominated actress Tovah Feldshuh delivers an enthralling, tour de force performance as Golda Meir (and, stunningly, 44 other characters) in Golda's Balcony, a Broadway play that originally opened in 2003, and after more than 500 sold-out performances, became the longest running one-woman show in Broadway history! And now, a rare, multicamera shoot from the play's original run that was recently unearthed (literally, from a safe) has been assembled into a new and absolutely riveting motion picture. Tracking the rise of Golda Meir from impoverished Russian schoolgirl to Prime Minister of Israel, Golda's Balcony offers an intimate look at one of the 20th Century's most iconic figures, transforming her life story into a cinematic event of overwhelming power and inspirational triumph.

THE OTHER STORY

Israel 2018 Director: Avi Nesher Hebrew with English subtitles 112 minutes

Drama

Set against a backdrop of fraught family dynamics and secular-religious frictions, this poignant and gently humorous drama from renowned Israeli director Avi Nesher unfolds with the tension and intrigue of a juicy thriller. Anat, a strong-willed and rebellious young woman, has suddenly found God. Much to the dismay of her secular family, she has embraced the Orthodox lifestyle, enrolled in a Jerusalem seminary, and is about to marry Shahar, a charismatic musician who was once part of Tel Aviv's wild club scene and has now become a devoted Hasid. Desperate to force Anat to reconsider her radical new path, Anat's divorced parents, along with her grandfather, devise a plot to thwart the upcoming wedding. Meanwhile, her grandfather, a psychologist, is counseling a divorcing couple embroiled in a bitter custody battle over their young son. The paths of both these troubled families will soon become intertwined in startling and unexpected ways. Deftly weaving together the multiple plot lines, The Other Story explores the secular-religious divide in present-day Israel, while offering an engaging and thought-provoking reflection on universal themes of identity, belonging, forgiveness and acceptance of "the other".

A young Jewish woman from Mexico City finds herself torn between her family and a forbidden love in this intimate, insightful and moving drama. 25-year-old Ariela is an independent-minded artist living with her family, among Mexico's close-knit Syrianfaced with the disapproval of her family and rejection by her insular Jewish community, where religious values and traditions run deep. As Ariela's place within her family and community is called into question, she must negotiate the labyrinth of familial pressure, religious precedent, and her own burgeoning sentiment. There are no easy choices to be made, as Ariela struggles with her heart to navigate a path forward, to find her own voice and become her own woman.

KING BIBI: THE LIFE AND PERFORMANCES OF BENJAMIN NETANYAHU

Israel/USA 2018 Director: Dan Shadur Hebrew & English with English subtitles 87 minutes

Documentary

Benjamin Netanyahu, or "Bibi", has now been Israel's longest-serving prime minister. Twenty years before the spectacle of Donald Trump's presidency emerged, Benjamin Netanyahu already understood the political benefits of creating an adversarial relationship with the media, and communicating directly with the public. This riveting documentary, brilliantly assembled entirely of archival footage from his public appearances over the years, tells the remarkable and controversial story of Benjamin Netanyahu's ascent to power. Tracking the media-savvy prime minister's career as he quickly perfected his skills as a master of public speaking and media manipulation, the film chronicles Bibi's evolution from Israel's great political hope, to a controversial figure whom some perceive as Israel's savior, and others – as a cynical politician who will stop at nothing to retain his power.

CHASING PORTRAITS

USA 2018

Director: Elizabeth Rynecki

English & Polish with English subtitles

78 minutes

Documentary

Moshe Rynecki was a prolific Warsaw-based Jewish artist whose body of work reached close to eight hundred paintings and sculptures before he was killed at Majdanek during the Holocaust. Aware that her family had only managed to save a small fraction of Moshe's works, and that many more pieces might have survived and still be out there somewhere, Elizabeth Rynecki, his great-granddaughter, has been on a decades-long quest to find the lost art. *Chasing Portraits* accompanies Elizabeth as she sets out on an emotional journey to rediscover her great-grandfather's legacy of stunning and evocative paintings depicting the everyday lives of the Polish-Jewish community prior to the war - a veritable historical treasure that offers a rare glimpse into a vibrant and thriving world that was all but erased by the Holocaust. Spanning decades of Elizabeth's life and four generations of her family, this heartfelt and very personal documentary is a deeply moving narrative of the richness of one man's art, the devastation of the Holocaust, and one woman's unexpected path to healing.

THE LIGHT OF HOPE

Spain 2018 Director: Silvia Quer Spanish, Catalan & French with English subtitles 96 minutes

Drama

This stirring Spanish drama is based on the inspiring true story of Elisabeth Eidenbenz, founder of the Mothers of Elne, a maternity home in the south of France on the Spanish border. In the late 1930's and early 1940's, as thousands of refugees flee Franco's regime in Spain and Vichy refugee camps, young Swiss volunteer Elisabeth Eidenbenz arrives in the south of France near Spain to aid those suffering from disease and malnutrition. Appalled by the dire conditions facing pregnant women, and children, Eidenbenz transforms an abandoned old villa into a birth clinic and safe haven for these young mothers, their newborn babies and small children. But when French authorities demand she turn over the Jewish refugees, Eidenbenz must make a decision that could endanger everyone in the maternity. By the end of the war, Elisabeth and her female staff had saved the lives of almost 600 infants. In 2002, Eidenbenz was honored by Yad Vashem as a Righteous Among the Nations.

THE TOBACCONIST

Austria/Germany 2018 Director: Nikolaus Leytner German with English subtitles 113 minutes

Drama

A captivating and moving drama about loss of innocence, The Tobacconist is based on the international bestselling novel by Robert Seethaler – a tender coming-of-age story about one young man and his friendship with Sigmund Freud during the Nazi occupation of Vienna. Franz, a naïve seventeen-year-old, journeys from his rural home to Vienna to apprentice at a tobacco shop. There he meets Sigmund Freud, an avid cigar smoker and regular customer, and over time, a singular friendship is forged between them. When Franz falls desperately in love with the music-hall dancer Anezka, he seeks advice from the renowned psychoanalyst, who admits that the female sex is as big a mystery to him as it is to Franz. As the political and social climate in Austria dramatically worsens with the Nazis' arrival in Vienna, Franz, Freud, and Anezka are swept into the maelstrom of events. Amid the dark shifts taking hold of the society around him, young Franz will need to decide where he stands.

MY WAR HERO UNCLE

Director: Shaked Goren Hebrew with English subtitles 59 minutes

Documentary

Shaked Goren, the film's director, was raised hearing stories about his war-hero uncle, Ami, who was killed at the age of 18 in the 1967 war. Through those stories, Memorial Day ceremonies, and the letters that Ami had sent home during his army service, his uncle Ami was always a present absence for his nephew Shaked. With his aging grandmother's health declining, Shaked applies, on her behalf, to the Defense Ministry for nursing care benefits to which she is entitled because of her status as a bereaved mother of an IDF soldier who "fell in the wars of Israel". His claim is rejected. Their refusal leaves him confused and he sets out to investigate. Fifty years after Ami's death, a shocking truth is unveiled, family secrets are uncovered and Shaked gains the strength to reveal one of his own.



THE RABBI FROM HEZBOLLAH

Israel 2019 Director: Itamar Chen Hebrew with English subtitles 64 minutes

Documentary

Who would believe that Avraham Sinai, an ultra-Orthodox Jew living in Israel, is Ibrahim Yassin - a Lebanese Shiite Muslim with an inconceivable and turbulent connection to Hezbollah. Born in a small village in Lebanon, he was destined to follow in his father's footsteps as a farmer and shepherd, but fate had something else in store for him. As his life unfolds, he is faced with difficult events that lead him to a point where death becomes his only wish. But just when it seems as if the story is over, a new one begins – an implausible story that sounds like a work of fiction, placing Yassin at the heart of some of the most daring, dangerous and secret operations Israel attempted in Lebanon in the 1980s and '90s. This intriguing documentary sketches an intimate portrait of a man who, through tribulations, circumstance and choice, became one of Israel's top international agents and spies.

Drama

Omri, a young IDF soldier critically injured during a Gaza military operation, lies comatose in a hospital bed while his anxious parents maintain a bedside vigil - rarely leaving Omri's side, speaking softly to him, praying and watching for any sign of improvement. His loving family, loyal friends from his army unit, doctors and therapists all rally around Omri in the battle to bring him back to life, while struggling to temper expectations and cope with the strain of the situation. During the long wait, there will be moments of heartbreak, humor and hope. Portrayed with a sense of intimacy and authenticity, this tender and beautifully rendered drama is a life-affirming and moving story of human resilience, family and the power of love.

FIDDLER: A MIRACLE OF MIRACLES

USA 2019 Director: Max Lewkowicz English 92 minutes

Documentary

More than 50 years after its Broadway debut, Fiddler on the Roof continues to be one of the most beloved musicals of all time - since its 1964 opening, it has been performed somewhere in the world every single day. What lies behind its enduring appeal? Why has the tale of Tevye the milkman and his five daughters resonated across cultures and captured the imaginations of audiences around the globe – from Japan and Thailand to Johannesburg and Mexico City? Seeking to answer these questions, this illuminating and highly entertaining documentary delves into Fiddler's creative roots in 1960's New York - a time of social upheaval and change - when "traditional" social conventions were being challenged by the rise of the civil rights and women's liberation movements. Alongside performance clips and rare archival footage, the film offers a wealth of fascinating anecdotes, insightful commentary and interviews with the musical's creators, original cast members, scholars, and more as it explores the universal – and still relevant – themes at the heart of the musical. Overflowing with the sweeping soundtrack of the show's memorable and beloved musical score, this joyful feel-good documentary is a loving tribute to a timeless cultural gem that will leave you humming the tunes long after the lights come up.
