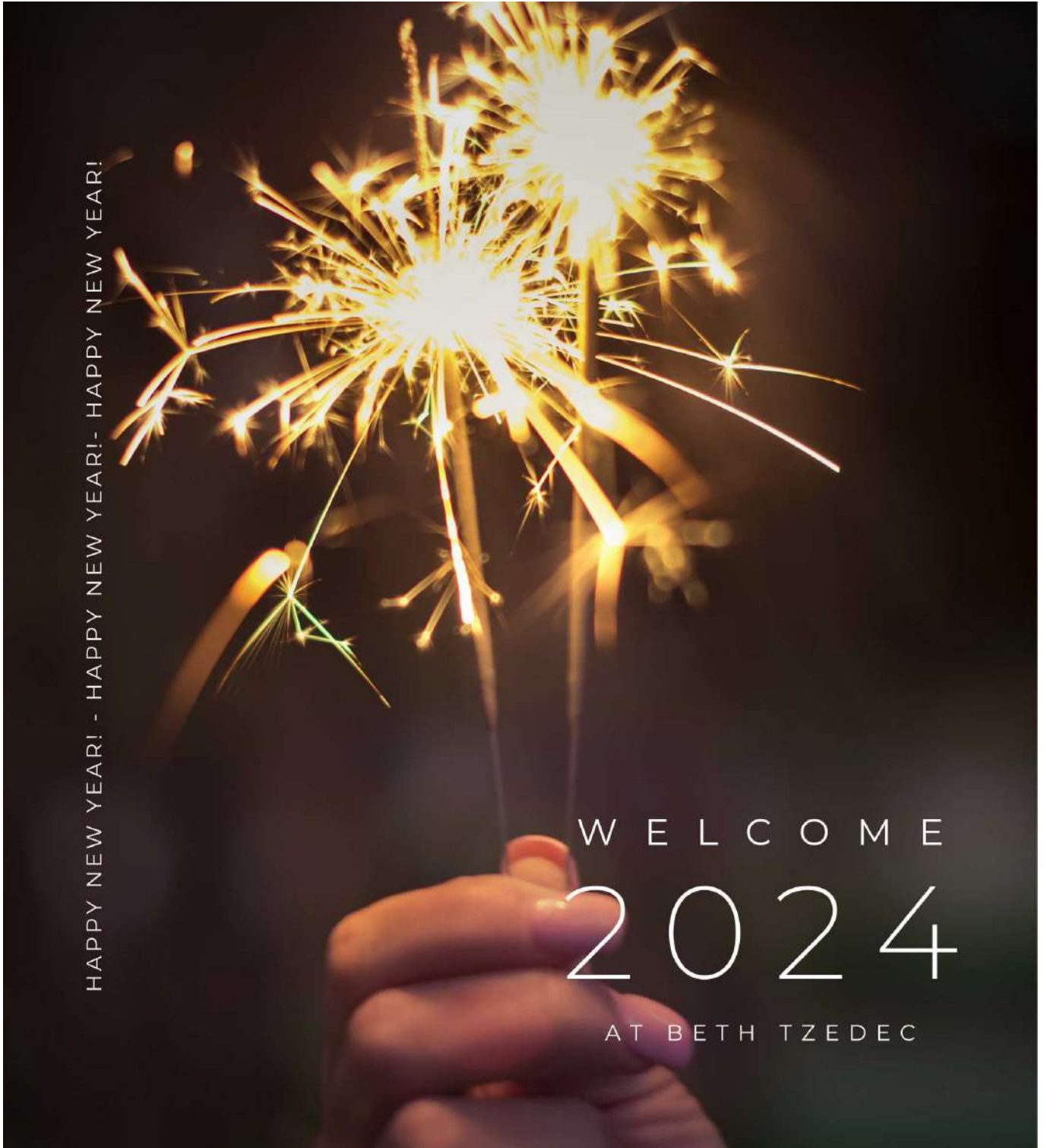

Secondly, mazel tov to Heather Khan Lister, our Director of Youth and Education, and Jennifer Girvitz, our events coordinator, and the entire team of Beth Tzedec staff and volunteers for yet another wonderful Family Hanukkah Celebration, which was attended by over 200 adults and children. Moving forward, the Ritual Committee – together with Rabbi Russ and Rabbi Ilana – have proposed a number of adjustments to how we conduct our services. Several of these have already been implemented, including holding Zoom-only weekday morning services, expanding the days and times at which we celebrate B'nai Mitzvahs and holding Shabbat morning services in the chapel rather than in the Sanctuary. The Beth Tzedec Board, executive and staff hope and pray for a resolution to the ongoing conflict in *Eretz Yisrael*. Our hope is that the remaining hostages are freed and peace and security may soon return.

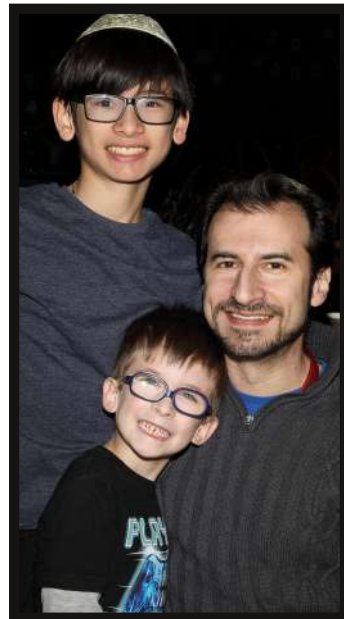
