Healing Together

It is inspiring to see how Beth Tzedec congregants and community members have come together since October 7.

We have all heard stories about the ways Israeli society became activated after October 7 – both in terms of military mobilization but also civilly. The 'Start Up Nation' quickly saw the launch of widespread formal and informal social start-ups. Moreover, Israel has seen an influx of Jewish volunteers from around the world, including several Beth Tzedec members who have already traveled to Israel to volunteer and many others who are planning to do so. Our global sense of Jewish community has never been so palpable.

The comfort of community is just as present in Calgary. It is inspiring to see how Beth Tzedec congregants and community members have come together since October 7. Leaders are popping up everywhere, and as a result of their collaboration with the Beth Tzedec team, we have been able to offer a variety of excellent programs and events for the rest of the community. This article is dedicated to celebrating the remarkable contributions of our community members.

In the aftermath of October 7, our community swiftly came together. Our thanks to Adam Silver, a Beth Tzedec member and CEO of the Jewish Federation, who, along with his team, organized a powerful solidarity event on October 11. This gathering provided a space for communal mourning, reinforcing our Jewish identity and support for Israel. It also featured non-Jewish leaders who unequivocally condemned the attacks and affirmed Israel's right to self-defense.

November saw the Beth Tzedec Board, under the leadership of Jessica Miller Switzer, collaborate with our remarkable office staff, including Jennifer Preece and Jennifer Girvitz, to put together our "Wall of Hostages". Displaying the names and faces of 238 hostages, this wall serves as a poignant reminder of the ongoing crisis, ensuring their stories are not forgotten.

Alicia Silver Thompson introduced an innovative awareness campaign in November and December, reminiscent of the 'Missing Children' milk carton campaigns of the past. The Beth Tzedec Library was packed with volunteers printing and sticking labels and packing and stacking milk cartons. By placing the faces and names of Israeli hostages on milk cartons and distributing them downtown, volunteers sparked important conversations about the ongoing situation, keeping the memory of the October 7 atrocities alive in public consciousness.

On January 10, our Hazak: Lunch and Learn program, run by Lila Mydlarski, featured a critical discussion on anti-Semitism in Calgary, led by long-time member David Prasow. Drawing from a recent conference in Ottawa, Prasow outlined comprehensive steps for combating anti-Semitism locally, emphasizing the importance of community mobilization and action.

February 6 marked another significant event, as new member Ortal Luzon and family, brought a special program to Beth Tzedec organized through Calgary Jews Stand United. Our community was fortunate to host Bassem Eid, a pro-Israel Palestinian speaker and activist. Eid's perspectives offered hope for peace and highlighted the value of moderate voices in the conflict who view Palestinian leadership as the problem and Israel as part of the solution. This event was a great learning opportunity for those who may not have heard Palestinian views in support of Israel.

Stacy Shaikin, our Engagement Director, facilitated a program with Allied Voices for Israel on February 8, providing teens and parents with tools to navigate and counter anti-Jewish sentiments in schools. This initiative offered practical strategies for addressing anti-Jewish hatred in educational environments.

On February 22, member Jennifer Mackenzie led "Yarns of Unity for the IDF," an important project to knit hats for IDF soldiers, sending a message of global support and solidarity.

And there is even more support for Israel on the horizon. Jamie Keltz brought forward and initiated an educational program for children, Israel at War. Featuring Rabbi Ilana, this program will be held at Beth Tzedec on Sunday, March 3 from 11:00am to 12:00pm. This session will explain the ongoing conflict in an age-appropriate manner to children from Kindergarten through Grade 5 (and their parents). We'll share some Israeli-style snacks and close out the session by making cards for IDF soldiers, further fostering a sense of connection and support from afar.

Then there will be the impossibleto-miss event put on by Dorit Gerov, President of Students Supporting Israel (SSI), on Monday, March 11. Or Elmakias, a survivor of the Nova Music Festival in Israel, is coming to Beth Tzedec to speak and answer questions about her experience. Doors open at 6:15pm with the event beginning at 7:00. **Click here to register**, and *kol hakavod* to SSI Calgary for this most important event.

Next month, our very own David Inhaber agreed to partner with Temple B'nai Tikvah for an event on Monday, April 1 at 7:00pm at Temple B'nai Tikvah, A Musical Hug From Israel. There, our communities will come together to listen and learn about the inspiring and moving Israeli music released since October 7 from Israeli music expert and radio personality Josh Shron. This is one more way for us to process collective grief and experience catharsis, while connecting to our broader Jewish community.

There may be other efforts I have overlooked, but I want to highlight that I am deeply grateful to all community members who, driven by their passion, have collaborated with us on these educational and community-oriented projects. This reflects our kehillah's capacity to lead, to care, to innovate and to collaborate. Let this be evidence to you that we are ready to collaborate, partner, and work with you.
