# Preparing for the New Year

At Rosh Hodesh Elul, we begin to stir with anticipation for this day of spiritual renewal.

Because there is so much at stake spiritually during Rosh Hashanah, we make preparations beginning a full month earlier. At Rosh Hodesh Elul, we begin to stir with anticipation for this day of spiritual renewal. We ready our minds for prayer and our hearts for forgiveness by doing whatever we can to attain God's compassion and mercy when the Day of Judgment arrives.

The most prominent feature of the month of Elul is the sounding of the shofar each morning, except on Shabbat. Three primary reasons are given for this practice. The first one is to confuse the *Satan* about the date for Rosh Hashanah, so that he will not be able to affect God's judgment of people with his accusations against them.

The second one pertains to a rabbinic legend which says that Moses' ascent to receive the second tablets on the first of Elul was accompanied by blasts of the shofar. Therefore, the shofar reminds us of the story of the Golden Calf and that we must always be aware of our potential for sinning.




The third one has as its source the famous phrase *Ani l'dodi v'dodi li* from the Song of Songs, which is heard at many weddings. The phrase means I am my beloved's, and my beloved is mine. The first letters of each Hebrew word in this phrase (aleph, lamed, vav, lamed) form an acrostic for the word Elul. From this hint, we gather that the period extending from the beginning of Elul through Yom Kippur (a total of 40 days) is a time ripe to become beloved by God. The shofar, with its stirring, evocative call helps attune us to that loving relationship.

Ultimately though, however you choose to engage with this month of sublime preparation, I hope you will take to heart the words of the Maharal of Prague who said, "All the month of Elul, before eating and sleeping, a person should look into his soul and search his deeds, that he may make confession not out of fear, but out of love."

May the coming year be one of rebirth, renewal, and peace restored for all!

# Reflecting on a Year of Community...

Shanah Tovah, everyone! May this new year be one filled with success, health, and joy for you, your families, and all of Israel. In the spirit of Elul, as I look back on the past year, I'm filled with gratitude about what we as a community have accomplished.

Homework Club & Shiluv: Thanks to the incredible generosity of donors like Arleine Chetner and Family, Helen Zenith & Newzones Gallery of Contemporary Art, Harvey Silverstone and many others who chose to remain anonymous, the Homework Club and Shiluv programs were able to offer 8 distinct programs to children and adults throughout the year. We delivered over 110 sessions and had approximately 100 visits per week by both children and adults, totaling around 1,100 visits over the year.

Shul School 2.1: This year, Shul School saw significant growth, expanding from 18 children last year to 25 this year. Thanks to the dedication of Hanit Jacobs, Orly Shalev, Keira Seidman, David Samchek and Shalev Gohar, we were able to deliver a dynamic and engaging calendar of unique programming for children from Kindergarten through Grade 5.

Adult Learning: The Elul Challenge of 2023 set a strong foundation for the year. Under Rabbi Russ's guidance, we delved into thought-provoking Hasidic philosophical topics, drawing about a dozen participants per session, at 8:00am no less!

Lila Midlarski's Hazak Lunch & Learn team consistently delivered important and engaging topics. Month after month, Lila thoughtfully curates speakers that enrich our lives with a diverse array of discussions that challenge and inspire us.

In addition, thanks to Orly Shalev, we were able to offer Adult Hebrew Literacy & Conversation classes throughout the year a a special three-week Hebrew Bootcamp for beginner and intermediate learners. Both programs were a tremendous success!

Community Engagement and Education: Flo Shustak and Stacy Shaiken's nearly monthly Thursday Night Live program provided a safe and encouraging space for participants to perform songs, skits and more in front of a live audience. Kids and adults, initially hesitant to step on stage, steadily honed their skills over time and gained comfort and confidence in the spotlight.

October 7: October 7 brought unexpected hardship. However, the strength of our community's leadership—from Beth Tzedec's executive team, Board and operations to the broader support from Calgary's Jewish community—enabled us to fill our shared spaces, including this synagogue, with powerful solidarity events, informative sessions, and marches that united us, lifted our spirits, and strengthened our resolve. If there's a silver lining in all of this, it's the undeniable proof of our organizations' and community's ability to collaborate and come together in solidarity.

Finally, a heartfelt thank you to everyone who has supported these programs—whether through your talents, time or financial contributions. We've had a wonderful year, and our community has been enriched in countless ways because of it.

Starting Tuesday, September 10, join us for Series 1 on Mussar, Series 2 on Deeper Insight into Jewish Prayer, and Series 3 on Yiddish Language & Literature.



# New This Year! In-Person is the Place to Be

We are really trying to encourage people to return to in-person services, especially on their team's day.

Starting last year, everyone who showed up in-person on their team's day received an extra point for each service attended.

Beginning in September, those attending in-person on any morning, whether it is their team day or not, will earn two points for their team(s). So essentially, they act as bonus days but only in the morning and only if members are in the chapel. They must still attend on their own day as well, if they are able.

The only caveat is that if it is their regularly scheduled day, they will only earn two points for their assigned team since that is why they are there. Their other team(s) will not be awarded points on that day. All other regular rules for their team are still in effect (3+3: Next Generation - under 39 years of age).

Why only mornings? Because the evenings generally have a more robust attendance, and we want the mornings to look the same.

Remember that in order to win a team prize, a player must have attended on at least six different

months on their team's assigned day. Attending in the morning and afternoon on a certain month still only counts as once for a prize. Bonus days do not count for this. Exceptions will be made for members who join later in the season yet show a commitment to the NML.

In addition, we ask players to attend on another day during their week if their day falls on a livestream date. B'hatzlacha to everyone in Season 10! I am looking forward to seeing how this season plays out with our new members and the new twist, and new divisional line ups.

Enjoy the rest of the wonderful weather that we have been having. My apologies if I have left someone out. I certainly did not mean to do that.


