As we anticipate Sukkot, our season of joy and gratitude, I am constantly reminded of how this festival invites us to step outside (literally and spiritually) into a space that is open to one another and to the Divine Presence that sustains us. A sukkah is intentionally simple. Its walls are temporary, its roof lets the stars shine through, and yet it becomes a place rich with blessings because we fill it with people, song, gratitude, shared meals, and the shared hopes and dreams of a recently birthed new year that pulsates with limitless potential.

Sukkot teaches that real security is found not in what we build for ourselves, but in the strength of community we build together. This year, we are especially blessed to welcome the holiday with a beautiful new sukkah for our synagogue. Make sure you take time to add your own voice and presence to the shmoozing and celebrating that makes the walls of both our Sukkah and our synagogue come alive. Whether you come for five minutes during the day or for an evening event, your presence completes the mitzvah of leyshev basukkah, allowing us to dwell together. Together, beneath branches and sky, we'll celebrate the abundance in our lives and renew our commitment to care for one another.

The Strength We Find Together

As we step into 5786, my hope is that the spirit of the High Holidays extends far beyond these days.

As I write this, we are in the heart of the High Holiday season. Rosh Hashanah has set the tone for the year ahead, and very soon we will gather again for one of the most sacred days of the Jewish calendar — Yom Kippur. These are days that always move me deeply. There is a special feeling in our sanctuary when we come together: familiar melodies, heartfelt prayer, and the sense that each of us is searching inward while at the same time being lifted by the strength of community.

I am especially grateful to our clergy, staff, and countless volunteers who make the High Holidays possible each year. From welcoming congregants at the door, to leading us in prayer and music, to organizing our children's programming, so many people work tirelessly — often behind the scenes — to ensure that our services run smoothly and meaningfully. As we step into 5786, my hope is that the spirit of the High Holidays extends far beyond these days. I encourage you to return often — for Shabbat, for learning, for celebrations, for moments of comfort and connection. The synagogue is at its best when it is alive with people, and when each of us brings our presence and heart to it.

I am thankful to be walking into this new year with all of you, and I look forward to what we will continue to build together.

Demystifying NML Points

We recently celebrated the winners of our 2024-2025 season at the annual NML Appreciation Dinner.

Have you ever wondered what all the "signing in" is about? Or how Bonus Day points are earned? Curious why having a Next Generation member on a team makes a difference—and maybe wondering if that could be you?

The truth is, it's not complicated. Many teams would love to have you join, and all you really need to do is show up on your assigned day (and as often as you can). The rest is taken care of by my wonderful spreadsheet—expertly built by Ken Hillaby, Beth Tzedec's capable accountant.

NML Scoring at a Glance

General Points

Morning service (assigned day):

+10 points

Evening service (assigned day):

+6 points

Both services on same day:

+4 points

If a minyan is not achieved, teams still receive full attendance points

In-Person Points

Attending in-person (assigned or bonus day):

+1 point per player

Extra morning attendance (not assigned day or bonus day):

+1 point per player

Be sure to sign in whenever you attend in person!

Bonus Days

When no team is assigned, the day is designated as a Bonus Day. Typically these occur on Sundays (with many attendees) and at the end of the month.

Next Generation Points

When at least one player aged 13–39 attends either service on their assigned day:

+2 points

3 + 3 Points

When at least 3 team members attend the morning service and 3 team members attend the evening service on the team's assigned day: +2 points

Every point matters! Your attendance supports the congregation, helps mourners say Kaddish, and keeps our daily minyan strong.


