THE BLOND BOY FROM THE CASBAH

France 2024 Director: Director: Alexandre Arcady French & Arabic with English subtitles 126 minutes

Drama

Antoine, a celebrated filmmaker, travels back to his birthplace, Algiers, with his young son to present his latest film: an account of his childhood in mid-20th century Algeria during the country's civil war. As he wanders through the city, the filmmaker immerses us in the moments of happiness, laughter, and tears of his childhood – spent between school, friends, and his Jewish family. Growing up during the final moments of Algeria's pre-independence period, the young Antoine discovers his profound fascination with cinema and starts to understand who he truly is. Based on French Jewish director Alexandre Arcady's childhood years in Algeria, this bittersweet semi-autobiographical dramedy presents an enchanting and nostalgic look at the vivid tapestry of life in the Casbah - a poor, multicultural section of the city where Jews, Muslims and Christians had once lived together in peaceful co-existence for generations.

AMONG NEIGHBORS

USA/Poland 2025 Director: Yoav Potash **English & Polish with English subtitles** 100 minutes

Documentary - USA

Today, in an era where difficult truths about the past are being silenced by a rightwing Polish government that seeks to deny any Polish complicity in the Holocaust, Among Neighbors investigates the story of a small, rural town where the longstanding peaceful co-existence between Jews and Polish-Catholic neighbors was shattered by World War II. Combining magical realism and evocative hand-drawn animation with revelatory interviews and verité footage, the film focuses on the only living Holocaust survivor from the town, and an aging eyewitness who, six months after the war had ended, saw Jews murdered there - not by Nazis, but by her own Polish neighbors. Produced and directed by award-winning filmmaker Yoav Potash, this powerful documentary uncovers accounts of love, betrayal, and a silenced and disturbing history.

LABORS OF LOVE: THE LIFE AND LEGACY **OF HENRIETTA SZOLD**

USA 2025 Director: Abby Ginzberg **English & Hebrew with English subtitles** 79 minutes

Documentary

A visionary leader, humanitarian, and one of history's most influential, yet underrecognized, American Jewish women, Henrietta Szold left an enduring legacy that continues to reverberate to this day. After visiting Palestine in 1909, she founded Hadassah, a Jewish women's service organization that would create a vital link between American Jewish women and communities in Palestine, empowering and inspiring hundreds of thousands of Jewish women to invest their energies in a cause that transcended their own personal lives. Through this organization, she established the region's modern healthcare system, built on a mandate to treat Arabs and Jews equally. Later, she spearheaded Youth Aliyah, an operation that rescued 11,000 Jewish children from Nazi Europe in the 1930's and transported them to safety in Palestine. Combining archival material, interviews and dramatic re-enactments, Peabody awardwinning director Abby Ginzberg gives long-overdue recognition to Szold's legacy and brings her inspiring story to life.

Dramedy

Arnon Noble is a religious man with a strong bond to his mother, a Holocaust survivor. He usually drives her to school lectures where she tells the students how she saved the lives of her baby boy and herself with the help of a thin gold ring. When his mother's health deteriorates, Arnon travels to her old hometown, Budapest, to search for the mythological ring that saved her life in the past. He turns for help to his estranged daughter, who is a TV researcher, and offers her to go on this journey together. Balancing humor and heartfelt drama, *The Ring* is a heartwarming story about three generations and the family history that reconnects them. The film was inspired by the true Holocaust survival story of director/actor Adir Miller's own family.

ALWAYS TOGETHER

Israel 2025 Director: Paz Schwartz Hebrew with English subtitles 72 minutes

Documentary

Displaced from their homes in the kibbutzim and villages along Israel's southern border with Gaza following the October 7th massacre, the twelfth graders of Nofei HaBsor, the regional high school, face an uncertain future. Scattered across the country and longing to be with each other, the students unite and appeal to the Ministry of Education. Their plea results in the establishment of a unique boarding school in Ein Gedi by the Dead Sea. In this moving and inspiring film, director Paz Schwartz intimately follows their year of living and studying together in this temporary sanctuary, grappling with the loss of family members and friends, and forging unexpected bonds as they navigate their final year towards graduation. Amidst all the trauma and loss that they have experienced, they have each other... for support, for healing and for hope.

THE SEA


Israel 2025 Director: Shai Carmeli-Pollak Arabic & Hebrew with English subtitles 93 minutes

Drama

Khaled, a 12-year-old boy from a Palestinian village, gets the chance to fulfill a dream and see the sea for the first time in his life on a school trip. But when they reach a military checkpoint, the soldiers claim that his entry permit into Israel is invalid and send him back home, while his classmates continue their trip. Deeply disappointed, Khaled sets out to reach the sea on his own - even though he doesn't know the way and doesn't speak any Hebrew. When his father, Ribhi, an undocumented laborer working in Israel, learns that his son is missing, he leaves his job in search of him risking arrest and the loss of his livelihood. A tender and poignant drama filled with human empathy, this beautifully made film follows young Khaled on his innocent and heartfelt quest to fulfill his dream. Winner of 5 Israeli Academy Awards, including Best Film, Best Screenplay and Best Actor, *The Sea* will be the official Israeli submission to the 2026 Oscars for Best International Feature Film.

SODA

Israel 2025 Director: Erez Tadmor Hebrew with English subtitles 96 minutes

Drama

This powerful drama is set in early-1950's Israel, where Eva, a beautiful seamstress, arrives with her daughter in a working-class neighborhood largely made up of former partisan fighters and young Holocaust survivors. Shalom Gottlieb, a former partisan leader and current factory foreman at the local soda bottling plant, falls for Eva, who offers him a chance at happiness and a life filled with beauty and laughter. But rumors of Eva's past as a Kapo (Nazi collaborator) during the Holocaust set off a storm of emotions and questions among the close-knit community, and Shalom finds himself at the centre of a moral conflict. His choice to be with Eva now means not only betraying his family, but also his fellow partisans and his duty to uncover her secret. Starring Lior Raz (Fauda) as Shalom, the film was inspired by the life of director Erez Tadmor's grandfather.

ADA: MY MOTHER THE ARCHITECT

Israel/USA 2024 Director: Yael Melamede **English & Hebrew with English subtitles** 81 minutes

Documentary

Ada Karmi Melamede is one of the most accomplished architects of her generation in her native Israel and abroad. A true pioneer who, like many successful working mothers of her time, was forced to make impossible choices, Ada designed some of the nation's most iconic public buildings and is a recipient of the prestigious Israel Prize. Her work gave physical form to some of Israel's highest democratic ideals, most notably in the acclaimed Supreme Court building in Jerusalem, the Open University, Ben Gurion Airport, and numerous civic institutions around the country. In this heartfelt and elegantly made documentary, her daughter Yael Melamede, a filmmaker and former architect herself, movingly profiles a woman and artist deeply tested by the realities of career and motherhood, a unique mother-daughter bond, and a fragile nation grappling with unrealized dreams.

CHARLES GRODIN: REBEL WITH A CAUSE


This entertaining and touching documentary pays tribute to the extraordinary life and career of a man who was not only a talented actor-comedian and broadcast personality, but also a tireless social activist. A master of dry wit and deadpan delivery, Charles Grodin captivated audiences with beloved performances in *The Heartbreak* Kid, Midnight Run, Catch 22, Beethoven, and countless sharp-witted late-night TV appearances. Raised in a Jewish household in Pittsburgh, his life embodied the concept of "Tikkun Olam". The film highlights his focus in later life on championing meaningful causes, using his platform as CNBC talk show host to advocate for justice and pressing social issues – in particular, his remarkable, decades-long fight to get wrongfully convicted people - most of whom were mothers of color with young children - out of prison. Through a treasure trove of film and TV clips, insightful interviews, and heartfelt reflections, this enlightening film celebrates a singular talent who left an indelible mark on both entertainment and humanity.

THE LAST TWINS

USA 2025 Directors: Perri Peltz & Matthew O'Neill English 80 minutes

Documentary

The Last Twins is the never-before-told story of an unsung hero of the Holocaust, Erno "Zvi" Spiegel, who risked everything to save dozens of young twins from almost certain death at Auschwitz. Under the shadow of Dr. Josef Mengele's horrific experiments, Spiegel used his courage, compassion, and ingenuity to shield the most vulnerable—the sets of twins targeted for brutal medical experimentation. Mengele put Spiegel in charge of the young boys, but Spiegel used his position to protect and comfort the children, all of whom had been torn from their families and subjected to inhumane tests under the constant threat of extermination. Through first-hand testimony and exclusive archival material, this poignant documentary brings to life the voices of those who survived because of Spiegel's defiance - a testament to resilience, sacrifice, and the power of one person to make a difference, even in humanity's darkest hour.

THE ROAD BETWEEN US: THE ULTIMATE RESCUE

Canada 2025 Director: Barry Avrich Enalish 95 minutes

Documentary

Perhaps the most talked about film of this year's Toronto International Film Festival (TIFF), The Road Between Us was originally pulled from the TIFF lineup to great controversy, only to be ultimately reinstated, and going on to win the festival's People's Choice Award for Best Documentary. The film follows retired Israeli general Noam Tibon, who on October 7, 2023, received a desperate text from his son Amir: Hamas terrorists had stormed Amir's home on a kibbutz near the Gaza border, and he, his wife, and their two young daughters feared for their lives. With no time to spare and relying only on his instincts and military training, Noam sets out from Tel Aviv – 85 kilometres away - together with his wife Gali - navigating ambushes, roadblocks, and a collapsing security system - in a relentless race against time to reach and save their family. Set against the backdrop of one of Israel's darkest days, and blending intimate firsthand testimony with the raw urgency of a survival thriller, this film is both a gripping cinematic retelling of an extraordinary rescue, and a profoundly human story about courage, family, resilience, and the human capacity for bravery and love in the darkest of moments.

DEAD LANGUAGE

Israel/Czech Republic/Poland 2025 Directors: Mihal Brezis & Oded Binnun **English & Hebrew with English subtitles** 110 minutes

Drama/Romance

While waiting at the airport for her husband, Aya is mistaken for someone else. Intrigued, she decides, on a whim, to pick up a total stranger instead. Their encounter sparks an unexpected intimacy that unsettles Ava's sense of certainty and awakens within her a yearning she neither fully understands nor knows how to fulfill. When the man abruptly disappears, Aya is left with a key to his hotel room and a yearning that perhaps only a complete stranger can fulfill. Featuring a superb performance by Sarah Adler as Aya, and nominated for 12 Israeli Academy Awards, Dead Language is a tender, quietly powerful drama about relationships and about longing — longing for connection, for meaning, for something beyond the confines of everyday life.

In their entertaining and insightful new film SWEDISHKAYT, self-proclaimed "international Yiddish-ish icons" YidLife Crisis - comedy duo Eli Batalion and Jamie Elman – embark on a whirlwind trip to Stockholm where they unearth a hidden treasure trove of Jewish culture. With their unique blend of humor and heart, Eli & Jamie explore the little-known history of Sweden's Jewish community – with tales spanning 250 years, from the earliest Jewish immigrants to discovering how Yiddish, an almost forgotten language, became a protected government-recognized language in Sweden. Along the way, they dive into a Yiddish cultural revival that's as unexpected as it is joyous. The result is a feel-good portrait of a small but robust community that, against the odds, is thriving - a universal story about diaspora, language, community, and resilience.

Eighty years after his liberation from Buchenwald, this captivating documentary offers an intimate and unprecedented look into the life and legacy of Elie Wiesel, one of the most profound voices of our time. Told largely through his own words and eloquent voice, Elie Wiesel: Soul on Fire seeks to penetrate to the heart of the known and unknown Elie Wiesel (1928-2016) - his passions, his conflicts and the enduring impact and relevance of his legacy as one of the most public survivors of the trauma of the Holocaust. With unique access to personal archives, original interviews and employing hand painted animation, the film illuminates Wiesel's biography as a survivor, writer, teacher and public figure.

Midas Man brings to life the story of Brian Epstein, the visionary whose unyielding belief in the Beatles' potential catapulted them from a scrappy Liverpool band into the biggest rock phenomenon of all time – and transformed music history forever. 


