Finding Holiness in the Ordinary: A Month for Gentle Renewal

When the shofar grows silent and the sukkah has come down, the true work of Jewish life begins.

After a month like Tishrei, filled with the awe of Rosh Hashanah, the intensity of Yom Kippur, the joy of Sukkot, and the dancing of Simchat Torah, the month of Heshvan can feel almost...empty. No festivals, no special observances, no great rituals that anchor our days. That is why our sages called this month *Marcheshvan* (bitter Heshvan) because the joy and drama of the holidays have passed, and ordinary life resumes.

But I think of this time differently. Heshvan is the month that invites us to find holiness in the ordinary.

It reminds us that spirituality is not confined to sanctuaries or sacred days; it lives in the way we greet each other in the morning, the patience we show in traffic, the compassion and help we extend to a friend in need. When the shofar grows silent and the sukkah has come down, the true work of Jewish life begins, transforming the everyday into a dwelling place for the Divine.

In our Torah readings for this month, we will have moved away from the sweeping universality of Creation and will find ourselves anchored in the particular story of Abraham and his journey. God calls to him, "Lech Lecha" (Go forth) into a new land, a new life, a new way of walking with purpose. That is what this quiet month also asks of us, to walk with intention and to carry the inspiration of the High Holy Days into the rhythm of daily life.

And speaking of inspiration, I want to take a moment to offer my heartfelt thanks to everyone who made our High Holy Days so meaningful this year. To all of our volunteers who polished silver, who set up the main sanctuary, who ushered and greeted, who leyned Haftarot, who davened sections of the service, and who supported our youth programing, thank you! Your dedication and generosity embody exactly what the month of Marcheshvan is all about, bringing holiness into ordinary acts of service.

May this quieter month be for us a time of rest, reflection, and gentle renewal. A chance to rediscover that the sacred is never far away. It is in the simple blessings of community, kindness, and care that we will continue to strengthen our synagogue and sanctify our days.

From the Director's Desk November Shofar

Celebrating Together, Under One Roof

Our building tells the story of our people—not only through our services and rituals, but through the voices, footsteps, and milestones that fill its halls.

Before stepping into my role as Executive Director, one of my key responsibilities at Beth Tzedec was managing rentals and community events. In that role, I had the privilege of witnessing firsthand the incredible ways our building comes alive when our members gather to celebrate life's most meaningful moments. Whether it's a wedding beneath a chuppah in our sanctuary, a Bar or Bat Mitzvah celebration in the Social Hall, or a baby naming surrounded by family and friends, I saw how our synagogue serves as both a spiritual and communal home—a place where joy and sacred tradition come together.

There is something profoundly moving about celebrating a simcha within the same walls where we pray, learn, and reflect as a congregation throughout the year. The same sanctuary that holds us in solemn moments on the High Holidays also embraces us in moments of laughter, music, and dance. Our building tells the story of our people—not only through our services and rituals, but through the voices, footsteps, and milestones that fill its halls. Each



celebration leaves an imprint, deepening the sense of connection that binds us together as a community.

At the same time, we know that for our building to continue being this warm, welcoming space, it must also be functional and comfortable for everyone who gathers here. During the High Holidays, many of you shared your feedback about one recurring challenge: the state of our aging HVAC system. It's no secret that our heating and cooling units have struggled to keep up, and replacing them has become one of the most urgent priorities of our Capital Campaign. Comfort may seem like a small thing, but anyone who has sat through a long service or simcha in a too-warm or too-cold room knows how much it matters. Our physical space should support the sacred moments that happen within it—not distract from them.

That is why our ongoing Capital Campaign is so vital. The planned improvements to our HVAC system, along with the renewal of our social hall, sanctuary, chapel, entranceway,


