On February 25, join us for a powerful and deeply moving evening with the Israel Guide Dog Center.

The program will feature Noach Braun, Founder and Co-CEO, who will share how the Center has advanced independence and dignity for Israelis living with vision loss, PTSD, and other disabilities for more than 30 years.
