Finding Faith in the Wilderness

The wildernesses in which we may find ourselves are not seen only as places of danger or confusion, they are also where profound transformation happens.

Tisha B'Av is a fast day that commemorates the destruction of our ancient temple, first in 586 BCE, then again in 70 CE. I fast and pray on Tisha B'Av, but I don't want the Temple to be rebuilt. I have severe doubts about what would happen at a restored Temple site. Given the chaos that has accompanied Women of the Wall and the development of an egalitarian prayer space at the Kotel, the thoughts of what scenes might be associated with a Temple restored doesn't do a lot for me.

Yet, I do mourn on Tisha b'Av. I grieve for the lost lives, the violence, and the hopelessness that plagued our people when both Temples were destroyed. I imagine structure, ritual and meaning destroyed, and what it must have been like staring into the abyss of a world where it seemed that God no longer dwelled. I cannot even start to imagine how scary and empty and unknowably sad it must have been.

That is why for us today, centuries after the Temple, Tisha B'Av has become a container into which we can pour all our sorrow and fear. For generations, Jewish catastrophes have been attached to this date. The Crusades are said to have been launched on this day. Expulsions from both England and Spain are connected with Tisha B'Av, as is the mass deportation from the Warsaw

ghetto to death camps during the *Shoah*. Tisha B'Av helps give shape to Jewish trauma. It is a day for communal mourning, for remembering what was and for lamenting the loss of what might have been.

Now a mythic telling of the Tisha B'Av story would end there, but that really doesn't work for me, and it might not work for you as a 21st century North American Jew. That is because, in the words of historian James Young, our traumatic memory is not only collective, it is also "collected." What this means is that our memory consists not only of the overarching story of our people, but also of personal narratives and experiences that we as individual Jews bring to the overall story. Sometimes, these individual experiences map easily onto the history of our people such as the firsthand accounts of Crusaders' rampages and the expulsion from Spain, or the oral histories that continue to chronicle the experiences of Holocaust survivors. Yet sometimes people bear sorrow that is not part of our collective Jewish myth but are still a central part of their own Jewish story and identity. Death, illness and violence haunt many of us, and many come to this day of communal sorrow with their own private burdens of suffering, not associated with the

destruction of the Temple.

When I fast on Tisha B'Av, I try to think of these people and their pain. I layer this onto my mourning for millennia of Jewish loss. I grieve for our collective trauma as well as for our

collected traumas, and I pray not for a rebuilt Temple but for a future where we will only tell stories of abundance and joy.

May you all have a restful and restorative summer.

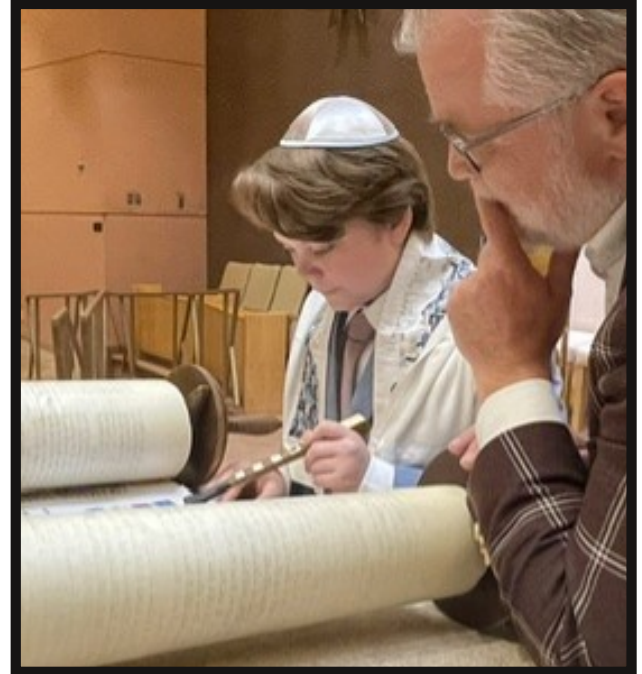

Volunteer Spotlight: Maxine Fischbein

Since joining Beth Tzedec shortly after moving to Calgary in 1993, Maxine Fischbein has been a dedicated volunteer, leader, and passionate advocate for our community. Over the years, she has served in countless roles, including as Ritual Chair, Vice President, and two-term President, while also contributing as a Shaliach Tzibur and Torah, Haftarah, and Eicha reader.

Maxine's commitment to Beth Tzedec is rooted in her love of Jewish life and the meaningful connections she has built with others along the way. We are grateful for the decades of wisdom, energy, and care she has shared with our kehillah — and we are delighted to celebrate her in this month's Spotlight.

How long have you been involved with Beth Tzedec? I have been an avid Beth Tzedec volunteer since shortly after my husband, first-born daughter Alysa, and I moved to Calgary in July of 1993.

What brought you to our congregation? We felt that a liberal congregation would be the best fit. Although Beth Tzedec was not egalitarian at that time, most Conservative congregations, at least south of the border, were already moving in that direction, so I believed that I would one day be able to fully participate in the ritual aspects of Judaism. That dream came true!

What roles or volunteer activities have you taken part in over the years? I have been blessed with countless opportunities. I served on the Sisterhood Board and Executive, volunteered for various synagogue fundraisers, programs and initiatives and eventually served on the shul Board of Directors. Along the way, I've been ritual chair, VP and eventually, a two-term president. I stepped back from governance in 2018 after serving as Immediate Past President but am once again serving on the Board and

Executive (VP Personnel). All of it has been an honour. Participating as a *Shaliach Tzibur* (Prayer Leader) and leining Torah, Haftarah and *Eicha* (the Book of Lamentations) has been a huge honour, for which I am indebted to the teachers, Rabbis and Cantors who have taught and mentored me. While I will be retiring from synagogue governance next spring (at the conclusion of my current term) I hope to continue serving on the ritual front, when needed, and supporting other worthwhile synagogue programs and initiatives.



What do you enjoy most about volunteering at Beth Tzedec?

Through the years, I have had the opportunity to meet so many wonderful people I might not otherwise have gotten to know. I am blessed to have many friends that I made simply by walking

through the synagogue doors and rolling up my sleeves in the company of so many people who care about synagogue and Jewish life and seek to do something about it! I have learned so much by connecting with the diverse range of people served by Beth Tzedec. It is truly a special place because of the people who walk through the shul doors saying *hineni*...here I am!

Is there a particular project, event or moment that stands out to you? Oh my goodness, there are so many! The Robbie Burnstein Dinners conceived and chaired by Leonard Seidman were so much fun! It is ironic—and don't tell anyone—that I learned how to enjoy a good cigar and an occasional shot of whiskey while doing some of my favourite writing EVER on those annual toasts to the lads! My other favourite moments are also people moments. I worked shoulder-to-shoulder with some amazing leaders, like Stuart Myron and Markham Silver, OBM. I don't think a day goes by that I don't say "What would Stuart do?" If the answer eludes me, I've got the luxury of calling him and finding out—he is always there for Beth Tzedec. I miss Markham. His legacy continues at Beth Tzedec.

What do you do outside of synagogue life? Since the mid-1980s I've been a freelance writer, often for Jewish publications. I am a voracious reader and I love to walk. Purchasing an Apple Watch has spurred me on—I typically do 10 to 12k a day, much of it walking the length of the Beth Tzedec lobby while practicing a Torah reading or Haftarah.

Do you have a favourite Jewish holiday, tradition, or memory connected to Beth Tzedec? My favourite weekly service is Rabbi Cantor Jayne's Kabbalat Shabbat service on Friday evenings. I don't always get there, because we are religious (excuse the pun) about Shabbat dinner at home with our family. But it is such a beautiful, musical service that moves me to a state of calm that is perfect for Shabbat.

What does being part of this kehillah mean to you? Wow, I could probably write a book about that. It's a family really. We sometimes disagree, but we mainly love each other. There is always someone to turn to when you need support. I think people who look at synagogue life as something that is transactional miss an important point. It is relational, and when you tap into that, it can be transformational. I'd write a book about that, but Ron Wolfson already has: *Relational Judaism*. In particular, people aspiring to Synagogue and community leadership should check it out.

Coffee or tea? Coffee. Lots of it! Doesn't have to be great coffee but it must have lots of caffeine in it.

Bagels or babka? Why would anyone choose? Montreal bagel with a New York Babka chaser.

What's something that always makes you smile? Jeopardy every night with my long-suffering husband. The two of us together could be one good contestant! But also, seeing my grandchildren. Milt and I have one granddaughter and one grandson. Fingers crossed for more...
